Visitation

from George Meyers During October, 1304 visitors came to the Preserve, 336 from 37 other states, 41 from 10 foreign countries and 927 from Oklahoma. 62 percent were first time visitors.

In November, 577 visitors came, 203 from other states, 12 from five foreign countries and 362 from Oklahoma. 63.1 percent were first time visitors.

In December, we had 417 visitors. 134 from 26 other states, 11 from four foreign countries and 272 from Oklahoma. 62.6 were first-time visitors.

- The bison are currently grazing in small bands all over the Preserve!
- Site preparation has begun on the new garage project, to be located just north of the current barn.
- A committee has been formed to consider turning the old barn into a visitors center, where the gift shop, docent office and nature exhibits will be located.
- The TU Board of Directors has approved the TU Research Center project, to be built east of the Stucco (Barnard) house at the Preserve. This building will provide research labs and dorm facilities and will be used by other universities as well as TNC.
- Controlled burns were made on Dec. 17 and 18.
- Volunteer needs include: Cleanup and Trash pickup! A Workday will be set for Spring (April) for this purpose.
- Gift shop proceeds purchased twelve heifer calves from TNC's Niobrara Valley Preserve in Nebraska. A total of 42 heifer calves and one yearling bull were purchased for the herd this fall.


