Visitation during the month of April was 1178 registrants! Of those, 438 came from 40 other states, 44 came from 11 foreign countries and 696 were from Oklahoma! This brings our visitor data figures to include visitors from 44 states and 19 other countries already.

Visitors from Texas, Missouri, Kansas and California still lead the list of states, with England and Germany tied among the foreign countries with 11 visitors each.

About 185 of this month's first time visitors were Pawhuska first and second graders! All reports indicate that they and their teachers and parents had a great time!

Prairie News

- Over 130 baby bison have been born as of early-May! The bison are grazing the large burn patches. With the arrival of the calves, the groups of adults are starting to come together. They are also starting to shed their winter hair.
- The trail upgrade is now complete. Both loops have been graveled, with berms installed on the stretches which are eroding. A steel bridge has been installed over the creek on the long loop, and the long loop has been expanded. This long loop is now officially called the "Prairie Earth Trail."
- Alan Brown, a volunteer from Atlanta, returned this year and has been painting the bison corrals. He will finish the paint job by May 30!
- There have been no burns or wildfires recently.
- Peter Pruett, a new Masters candidate under Dr.
 Jim Shaw at OSU, has started a research project focusing on the use of

- shed bison wool by burrowing rodents.
- In the TU project, the researchers are starting to test different plant species for revegetation of remediated oil spill sites.
- The structure is now complete for the new garage. Electrical and water will be installed by the end of May.
- The cowboys have been removing old fence and cattle pens, and building work benches and shelving for the new shop.
- Volunteer assistance is needed to clean up litter along the roads through the preserves.
- Plant growth got off to a good start this spring, although, prior to last weekend, it had been a little hot and dry. Wildflowers are coming on, with a good display visible along the nature trail.
- Special thanks to Jan and Ted Holsemback and their crew of volunteers for cleanup along the roadside on April 11.
