Visitation – April

Visitation was just fair in April. 910 visitors signed in, 22% below last year 1,176, but just under the 7 year average of 914. Year to date, visitation of 2.045 is 12% less than the 7 year average of 2.320. We had 42 visitors from 13 other countries, with England (14), France (5), Norway (5). Australia (4) heading the list. 253 quests from 36 states other than Oklahoma signed in, headed by Texas (46), Kansas (23), Oregon and Wisconsin (12 each) and Arkansas (11). 615 Oklahomans signed in. 41 of the foreign visitors were firsttimers, along with 185 of outof-state visitors and 253 Oklahomans. Year to date, we have had visitors from 43 states and 23 other countries.

As usual, Friday, Saturday and Sunday were the most popular days to visit, and mid day the most popular time. We had one day when 183 visitors signed in. The docents were BUSY!

Visitors comments included, "Beautiful, I'll come again!", "Didn't realize what was in my backyard." A Belgian commented "Bigger than in the movies!" Other comments, "Wild and wonderful", "Wow", "Awesome", "Glad to see places this wide open still". A middle school science club instructor commented "Outstanding, Great instructors."

SNAKE LECTURE - by Mary Coley

I rarely give lectures, and would rather instruct in other ways. But....

The EVENT: Recently, a long, black snake was found basking in the sun on the veranda of the headquarters building. Anxious docents rushed for help to identify the snake. Someone identified it as a cottonmouth, (witnesses said due to the white lining of its open mouth).

A cottonmouth is a heavy-bodied, dark colored, semi-aquatic snake that is dark olive-brown to nearly black. The head is noticeably wider at the neck. A black stripe may be present from the snout through the eye and onto the neck. Most specimens have a white upper lip. The belly is cream colored and heavily mottled with dark brown blotches and smudges. Adults range in length from 30 to 42 inches. When in a defensive posture, they gap their mouths, showing the white lining, and vibrate their tails. Classified as a pit viper, they eat a variety of animals, from fish to snakes and birds, and prefer cool, rocky creeks and small rivers.

The snake was beheaded. The remainder of the snake was saved for our nature room coordinator, Doris Mayfield.

The INVESTIGATION: Uncertain as to the true identity of the snake, Doris took the snake to Rusty Grimpe, reptile curator at the Tulsa Zoo. After inspection, even without the lost head, Grimpe identified the snake as a Black Rat Snake.

The black rat snake eats a variety of rodents, killing by constriction. The Black Rat Snake is slender and shiny black, with a white upper lip and chin. The belly has a black and white checkerboard pattern anteriorly (toward the head), changing to a mottling of gray, brown and white or yellow posteriorly (toward the tail). They usually range in length from 42 to 72 inches as adults.

SNAKE FACT: Most snakes have a white lining inside their mouths. The cottonmouth only has that name because it tends to hold its mouth open more often, displaying this white interior.

The MORAL: We are all learning. This lesson was toughest for the Black Rat Snake. In the future, please don't rush to kill a snake. They are an important part of the natural prairie ecosystem. Give them the space, and the respect, that they deserve.

REMINDER: The Tallgrass Prairie Preserve is a PRESERVE! Snakes and other creatures are <u>supposed</u> to be living here. Do NOT kill <u>anything</u>! If you encounter a species you think may be harmful, back away and leave it alone! In public areas, encourage the snake to move on. They are frightened of people, and are not aggressive unless surprised.

FACT: The WESTERN COTTONMOUTH has NOT been found by biologists on the Preserve. It is not listed in our brochure of animal species found here. END OF LECTURE
