June 2001 Visitation

from George Meyers

June visitation was not up to par. 1,550 visitors signed-in, the third lowest June in 8 years, and 31% less that June 2000. We had 29 visitors from 13 other countries, with Australia (6), Germany (5), France (4), and Argentina, Canada, Italy and Lichtenstein (2 each) leading the list. We had 532 visitors from 36 other states with Texas (64), California (53), Kansas (43), Missouri (40) and Ohio (32) leading. We had 987 from Oklahoma and 1 each from Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands. 22 of the foreign visitors were first-timers, along with 364 of out-of-state visitors and 499 Oklahomans. Year to date, we have had visitors from 48 states, Washington D.C., 2 U.S. possessions and 41 other countries. 57% of the visitors were first-timers, 76% of foreign visitors, 68% of visitors from other states, and 51% of Oklahomans. Many are coming back for a second and third

Visitors were quite evenly spread over the week, with Tuesday being the slowest day. As usual, mid day was the most popular time to visit

(80% visit between 9:30 and 3:30pm). We had one Sunday with 103 visitors signed in.
